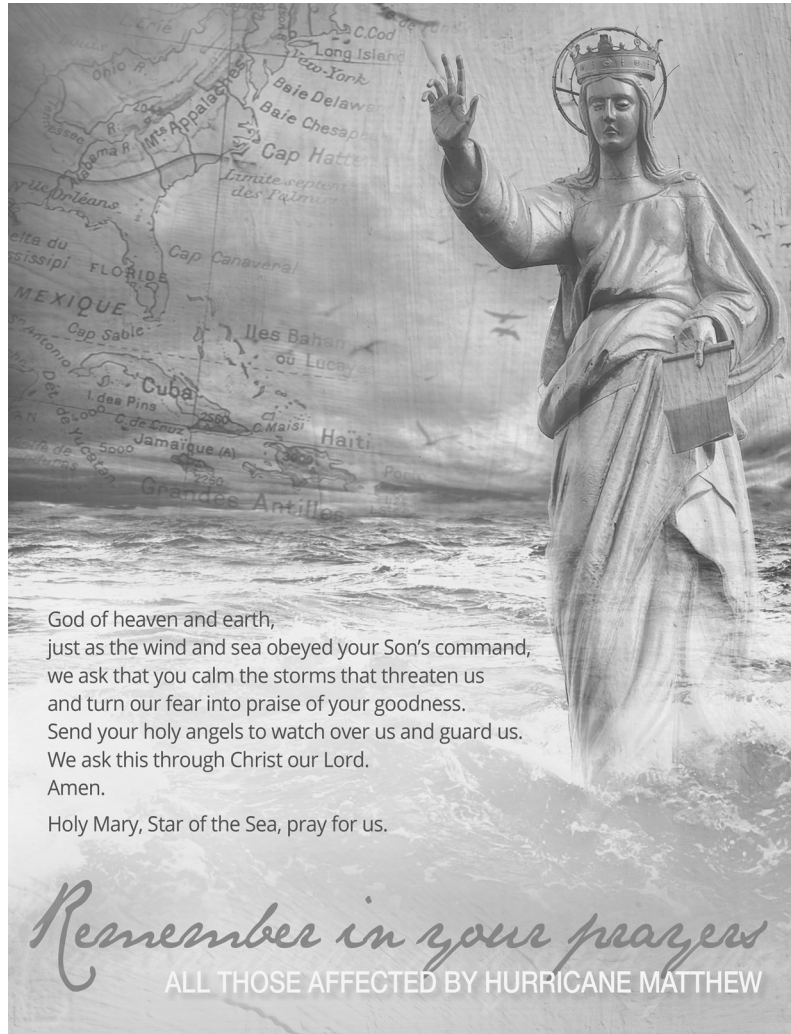

### Celebration of Sacraments

**Anointing of the Sick** – Call the office to schedule this sacrament if you are to have surgery or if a family member is seriously ill.  
**Baptism** – Baptisms are celebrated the second Sunday of the month. Call the office two months in advance. First-time parents must attend baptism preparation sessions (held four times a year.) Call the office to pre-register.  
**Marriage** – Call the office six months in advance to schedule date and begin the necessary preparation.  
**Reconciliation** – Saturdays from 3:00 - 4:00 pm. You may also call the office for an appointment.
